District Attorney Sam Sutter today announced that Reggie Greene, 28, of New Bedford, was ordered held without bail during his arraignment today in New Bedford District Court.

Mr. Greene is charged with murder and accessory to murder in connection to the previously unsolved June 2006 homicide of 35-year-old Antonio Semedo. Mr. Greene pleaded not guilty during his arraignment today and is due back in court June 17th for a pretrial hearing.

After an extensive investigation into the June 18, 2006 slaying, state and local police on Saturday arrested Reggie Greene, 28, of New Bedford, and charged him with murder and accessory to murder before the fact.

This is the ninth time District Attorney Sutter's Cold Case Unit brought new murder charges in a previously unsolved homicide from a previous administration since he took office three-and-a-half years ago.

Mr. Greene was arrested without incident Saturday afternoon at the New Bedford Police Station, after being brought there for questioning by lead investigators State Trooper Ann Marie Robertson of District Attorney Sutter's State Police Unit and Andrew Simmons of the New Bedford Police Department.

Mr. Semedo, of New Bedford, was found shot to death inside his car on the off ramp from Route 18 northbound to South Second Street around 3:15 a.m. on the morning of June 18, 2006.

All reports associated with the case were impounded by the court today because of the ongoing nature of the homicide investigation. No further information about the facts of the case can be released at this time.

The investigation into the four-year-old cold case homicide was spearheaded by District Attorney Sutter's Co-First Assistant District Attorney William McCauley. Mr. McCauley heads up District Attorney Sutter's Cold Case Unit and oversees all homicide investigations in Bristol County.

The arraignment was handled by Assistant District Attorney Jack Stapleton of District Attorney Sutter's Homicide Prosecution Unit.

District Attorney Sutter campaigned in 2006 on a promise to focus much more attention on Bristol County's approximately 80 unsolved homicides from 1991 through 2006 and some others from the 1970s and 1980s.

During his first three-and-a-half years in office, Sutter's Cold Case Unit has now brought charges in nine previously unsolved homicides from prior administrations. Two of those nine cases have now gone to trial, both of which resulted in first-degree murder convictions.

To continue the progress being made on solving previously unsolved homicides, District Attorney Sutter has also established an anonymous unsolved homicide tip line and a web site devoted to some of Bristol County's unsolved homicides.
