Christopher Fisher, 24, of Fall River, pleaded guilty today in Taunton Superior Court to a charge of manslaughter connected to the February 27, 2007 stabbing homicide of 28-year-old Jason Glover on Dwelly Street in Fall River.

Mr. Fisher was sentenced to serve 19 years to 19 years and one day in state prison on the manslaughter charge.

However, that sentence will not begin until Mr. Fisher completes serving two separate state prison terms for cases involving assaults on correctional officers. In July, 2009, Mr. Fisher was convicted in Plymouth County of assaulting a correctional officer, and was ordered to serve two years in prison. Then, in January, 2010, Mr. Fisher was convicted in Norfolk County of assaulting a correction officer, and was ordered to serve two to two-and-a-half years in prison after the completion of his Plymouth County sentence.

In all, Mr. Fisher will have to serve 23 years to 23-and-a-half years in state prison for all the charges. Mr. Fisher will also be placed on probation for 10 years upon his release from prison.

"The sentence the defendant will now serve will closely resemble the sentence he would serve if he had been convicted, after trial, of second degree murder," District Attorney Sam Sutter said. "After meeting with the victim's, Mr. Glover's, family, it was clear that they wanted the certainty of a conviction and a lengthy state prison sentence. Therefore, I am satisfied with this disposition and pleased that Mr. Glover's family received a measure of justice for this senseless killing."
